

Winter 2019 Learn to Skate USA Youth and Adult Hockey Classes

<u>Tuesdays (Youth Only):</u> January 8th-February 26th **OR** <u>Saturdays (Youth & Adult):</u> January 12th-March 2nd \$10 on-line (registration discount through Sunday, January 6th!



Student Benefits:

- Eight youth hockey classes for \$127. Hockey tuition is offered at this reduced rate as practice ice is not offered on class days for skaters participating in this curriculum.
- 30 minute lesson once a week on Tuesdays **OR** Saturdays.
- <u>Two</u> make-up class opportunities per semester for a maximum of 8 classes. Make-up classes may not be taken on the following days: 01/08, 01/12, 02/19, 02/23, 02/26 or 03/02.
- Free skate rental for class please request hockey skates.
- Ice House class card with UNLIMITED free public skate sessions, *skate rental not included*. Class card must be presented for complimentary or reduced admission prices and is <u>for enrolled student only</u>. Class card and benefits expire at the end of enrolled term.
- \$0.25 soda drinks in eatery & 10% off regularly priced merchandise in the Pro Shop <u>for student only</u> with class card.
- US Figure Skating Basic Skills membership, progress record book, sports accident insurance and the Basic Skills Skating magazine.

Enrollment Information:

- All first time enrollees ages 6 and up **must** register for Hockey 1. Skaters 15 and up should register for the Adult Hockey Workshop on Saturdays.
- Once registered, class day may only be changed with Skating Director approval and upon payment of a \$15 fee.
- Skating Director reserves the right to combine or cancel classes based on attendance levels. If only one student attends a class, this student will receive a 20 minute lesson (instead of 30 minutes) as this is a private lesson. At the conclusion of the 20-minute lesson, the skater may remain on the ice in their designated class space and practice on their own.
- There will be no make-up guarantee for classes canceled due to Acts of God and/or mechanical issues.
- Refunds (less \$20 administrative fee) for classes not taken, must be requested to Skating Director by week 3. LTS class card must be forfeited in conjunction with the refund request.

Class Day Information

- Dress warmly in layers. Wear gloves or mittens and only 1 pair of *long* socks. Skates should fit snuggly and be tied or fastened tightly from the toe up.
- Arrive at least 20 minutes early. In order to be admitted to class, class card must be presented each and every week at the Learn to Skate check-in table located in the front lobby. A class card, with intact make-up "punches," must be presented to the Learn to Skate table attendant in order to be admitted to make-up classes. A maximum of 8 classes may be taken. Make-up classes may be taken week two through week six.
- After presenting class card to Learn to Skate table attendant for class or make-up, please proceed to the skate rental counter to obtain **hockey** skates.
- Youth and Adult Hockey classes meet at the scoreboard end of the rink near locker room 3 and the Visitor's bench.
- Hockey equipment is not required. Safety helmets are also not required or provided, but we do recommend them for beginner skates. All helmets must have a chin strap.
- All elements will be taught without a stick or puck as proper skating technique is the primary focus.

Adult Hockey students may utilize the free practice ice for the 30 minutes immediately preceding class.
