Learn To Skate Class Cards

- All enrollees should pick up their “Learn to Skate class card” from the Learn to Skate table located in the front lobby of the rink before their first class.
- The class card serves as skaters’ admission pass to classes and **must be presented each week at the Learn to Skate table**. FREE skate rental is provided for classes.
- **The class card also serves as FREE admission to public skating sessions upon presentation of the card to the front office. Skate rental is not included during public sessions!**
- *Skaters enrolled after 12pm the day before scheduled classes are set to begin will receive their class card on the next class day (the following week) in order to give us time to make the class card.* Class cards for skaters pro-rating and registering after the first class week will also be available at the next class date.
- The unlimited free public skate admissions are included with the hope that students will utilize these free skating opportunities to work on skills taught in classes. Practice makes perfect!

Card Benefits

- **Class card benefits are for the enrolled skater’s use only and expire at the end of the current semester.**
- The class card entitles students to UNLIMITED free public skate admissions, skate rental not included. Students must present their class card at the front register in order to be granted free public skate admission.
- **Lost cards will not be replaced.**
- Enrolled skaters enjoy 10% off in our Pro Shop. Please let us know if we can size students for skates! Purchasing skates saves money (as skate rental is not included with the unlimited free public skate admissions) and owning skates helps to ensure optimal fit, support and consistent sharpening.
- Enrolled skaters are eligible for \$0.25 soda drinks from the Snack Bar upon presentation of a current class card.

Make Up Classes

- Skaters will be permitted up to **TWO** make-up class opportunities on the alternate class day. Skaters must present their class card and a make-up class “punch” will be taken for make-up classes.
- Skaters are permitted a **maximum of 8 classes**. If students reach 8 classes prior to the end of the term (by misusing make-up classes), they will not be permitted to take the remaining classes without paying additional fees. **Make-up classes may be taken ahead of missed classes, however make-up classes are not permitted on the following dates: 03/05, 03/09, 04/16, 04/20, 04/30 and 05/04.**

Class Day Changes, Refunds, and Cancellations

- Once registered, class day may only be changed with Skating Director approval and upon payment of a \$15 fee.
- Refund requests may be requested through week 3. Approved refund requests will be issued for classes not taken, less a \$20 administrative fee. The Class Card must be forfeited at the time of the refund request.
- There will be no make-up guarantee for classes canceled due to Acts of God and/or mechanical issues.

Complimentary Learn to Skate Practice Ice

- The complimentary ice time is for currently enrolled skaters *only* and the time is to be used for concentrated practice.
- Chasing, racing, roughhousing and/or horseplay are not permitted for the safety of our skate school participants. Camel spins and backward spirals are also not permitted for safety reasons.
- Shoes are not permitted on the ice.
- Snowplow 1-4, Hockey 1-4, Basic 1 and Adult 1-3 students do not have practice ice time, which is reflected in the reduced tuition rate for these classes.

Progress Report & Celebration Ceremony

- Every effort should be made to attend class during week 7 in order to have a Progress Report administered by the skater's regular instructor.
- Week 7 classes are held Tuesday, April 16th and Saturday, April 20th. **Progress Reports will not be administered on the last class day for skaters who miss the 7th class** as coaches are busy conducting the last class and the celebration ceremony requires the full attention of the Skating Director.
- **No classes week 8: Tuesday, 4/23 & Saturday, 4/27 due to Easter / Spring Break.**
- Celebration ceremonies will take place during week 9 - Tuesday, April 30th and Saturday, May 4th. Please inform the Learn to Skate table attendants **in advance (ideally by week 5)**, if there are extenuating circumstances that preclude skaters from attending during progress report classes, or from the celebration ceremony, and we will try to work with you to make alternative arrangements.

We hope that with your participation we can make our Learn to Skate program a successful step in the development of figure skaters and hockey players of all ages! We ask that you keep our #1 goal of "FUN" in mind. While we want the Skate School to be a step in the developmental process of figure skaters and hockey players, the main idea at this stage is to develop FUNdamentals and to instill in the students a passion for ice sports.
